MINUTES OF EMERGENT MEETING OF ACADEMIC COUNCIL MODE: THROUGH ZOOM

1. Introduction of new courses

Item was discussed and approved in principle with the addition that new courses should be started by GIETU, as per AICTE/UGC regulations. The nomenclature of new courses, eligibility criteria, duration of course, scheme and syllabus shall be recommended by the respective Board of Studies (BOS). Council authorized the Vice-Chancellor-cum-Chairman, Academic Council to approve such new courses.

2. Change of Nomenclature of some of the UGC courses as per UGC nomenclature.

Specialization Degree

Academic council has decided, to enhance the Employability university will start Concept of Specialization Degree. Under this concept one discipline of students, if interested to study in specialized open electives courses, can continue with their favorite stream of subjects offered in a particular basket of electives. This course will have industry designed value added courses and hands on towards skill development to suit industry ready candidates. The course ends up with a major project in that specialization. University will provide these students specialization degree in a particular stream. This concept will support Students in employability.

The BOS of concerned discipline shall make academic regulations.

Vice-Chancellor-cum-Chairman, Academic Council was authorized to approve the recommendations of the committee and Academic Regulations framed by BOS.



3. To implement AICTE Model Curriculum from session - 2019-20 . To approve minutes of various Board of Studies for revision of syllabus / scheme /nomenclature of courses.

- I. To discuss and approve the revision in curriculum structure of B.Tech Programmes with 164 credits, by introducing project in every semester with one credit.
- II. It was decided to assess and evaluate the tutorial hours with specific accountability , Course Outcomes are to be given for all UG and PG courses
- III. Two new credit courses will be added Human values and Professional ethics and Nutrition and Dietrics in all programmes.
- IV. Research Ethics to be included in the course work as suggested by UGC
- V. Council discussed the syllabus updation and approved the same with the following addition that a committee to be constituted by the council to recommend the specializations for B.Tech & MBA Programme which shall be approved by the chairman' Academic Council.

4. Introduction of MOOCs Courses and credit's mobility as per UGC guidelines.

The respective BOS shall recommend on line MOOCs courses i.e. enlist the courses to be offered and credits to be transferred to the students as per guidelines. Vice-chancellor-cum-chairman, Academic council was authorized to approve the recommendations of the committee and Academic Regulations framed by BOS.

5. Deciding on strategy that should be implemented by the University for maintaining the Social Distancing after lockdown is open.

6. Deciding about the mode of examination and strategy for UG & PG and Pre.Ph.D intermediate semesters and students of terminal semesters of 2019-20 of various courses of the university
